The Council met with Delegate Al Carr to discuss CCV's three-year effort to secure speed cameras on Connecticut Avenue. To ensure that the speed cameras are located by MCPD in locations that will be the most effective in reducing speeding on Connecticut Avenue, it was agreed to ask MCPD traffic safety officials to meet with CCV and Town of Kensington officials and Mr. Carr to explain the factors used to determine the proposed cameras placement locations.

The Council also discussed with Mr. Carr the current status of CCV's proposal to the County Executive regarding sharing and use of revenues from the speed cameras, as well as Mr. Carr's role in supporting future CCV safety initiatives.
